AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF OXFORD, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE CONVEYANCE OF REAL PROPERTY AND ALSO AN INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE TOWNSHIP TO THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation ("State"), is undertaking certain infrastructure improvements along parts of State Road 31 within the Township of Oxford ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, as part of the Project, it is necessary for the State to acquire, either as fee simple or as an easement, property owned by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township previously authorized the execution of, and did in fact execute, certain Agreements of Sale, which delineated the property to be acquired as part of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to ratify via Ordinance the conveyance of interests in property owned by the Township to the State as detailed below; and

WHEREAS, said conveyances to the State will serve a public purpose by improving infrastructure for the motoring public and is authorized by N.J.S.A. 40A:12-5.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Oxford, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the Township does hereby authorize the conveyance of easements to the State of New Jersey, Department of Education, as set forth in Exhibits 1 & 2, attached hereto.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Oxford, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the Township does hereby authorize the conveyance of fee simple ownership to the State of New Jersey, Department of Education, as set forth in Exhibit 3, attached hereto.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the foregoing conveyances are effectuated pursuant to, and in accordance with, certain Agreements of Sale for the Route 31 Furnace Brook Project, bearing NJDOT Contract Number 047093250, which Agreements of Sale were executed by the Township on March 3, 2025 and which are hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth in full herein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Mayor and Acting Municipal Clerk are authorized to execute any and all such agreements required to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-09 TOWNSHIP OF OXFORD

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL PURPOSES FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF OXFORD AND APPROPRIATING \$204,974 FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF OXFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Township of Oxford, in the County of Warren, New Jersey, authorizes various capital improvements to be undertaken, including road repairs for storm damaged roads, including but not limited to Maple Avenue, Bush Street, Sharrer's Place, and other roads in need of repair as deemed appropriate by the Township Engineer and the Department of Public Works Supervisor in the Township of Oxford, to be funded from the sources specified in Section 2 of the Ordinance.

Section 2. The amount of \$204,974.01 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in Section 1 of the Ordinance and which amount was funded from the Capital Improvement Fund in the amount of \$204,974.01.

- In connection with the purpose and the amount authorized in Sections 1 and 2 hereof, the Township determines the purpose described in Section 1 hereof is not a Current Expense and is an improvement which the Township of Oxford may lawfully make as a general improvement.
- All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this Section 4. Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon due passage and publication according to law.
